

Middle School Band Students and Parents:

Families often have questions about music opportunities for students at Southridge High School. This flyer provides an overview of those opportunities and includes a calendar of events for students and parents.

Curricular and Extra-Curricular Music at Southridge

Music courses offered at Southridge vary from year to year depending upon enrollment. Offerings have included Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Percussion Ensemble, Guitar, and Music Theory. Detailed course descriptions may be found in the Southridge Academic Program Guide. These academic courses are the curricular portion of music at Southridge. Each year, band students have the opportunity to compete in solo competition and audition for all-state honor bands through the Oregon Music Education Association and OSAA.

SIMDE extra-curricular music and dance opportunities at Southridge are optional and most require additional fees. Some fundraising is available. For high school students, extra-curriculars include Marching Ensemble, Winter Percussion, Winter Guard, Musical Theater Pit Orchestra, and Basketball Band. For middle-school age students, SIMDE offers Youth Guard and Youth Percussion Ensemble.

Band Curriculum & Forecasting for Freshman

Most freshman instrumental music students enroll in Concert Band. When filling out their first high school forecast sheet in 8th grade, students will select Concert Band. Percussionists should forecast for Percussion Ensemble. If enrollment is not high enough to allow a separate Percussion Ensemble, percussionists will be placed in Concert Band. More advanced musicians may be recommended by their middle school band director to forecast for Symphonic Band or Wind Ensemble. Enrollment in Wind Ensemble requires an audition with the Southridge band director.

Students attend band class like any other class. Concert band students usually perform in three concerts per year, a band festival, a parade, and Southridge's graduation. A few rehearsals may be held outside normal class hours.

It is possible to take band all four years, meet all graduation requirements, and take AP or IB classes, if desired. Most non-band students complete their PE and health requirements in grade 9 and 10. Band students sometimes shift some PE and/or health classes to later years.

Marching Band

The Southridge marching band is an exciting, competitive show band. The band performs at home football games, marches in parades, and competes at band competitions. Joining the marching band is a great way to become involved at Southridge. The band provides an opportunity to make friends from all grade levels, gain confidence from performing and competing, earn a varsity letter, and boost school spirit.

As with any rewarding activity, marching band requires a time commitment. Rookie welcome camp is in June. Band camp is at school for at the end of August. During the fall, there are practices and performances each week with competitions on several Saturdays. The season ends by early November. All Band students are encouraged, but not required to be in the marching band. Option school students living within the Southridge attendance area may also join the marching band. There are participation fees for marching band. Some fundraising is available.
